# THE PACIFIC BELT

## Championship Syllabus

### QUALIFYING

Open to dancers who meet at least one of the following criteria (recorded at time of entry):

- Recalled\* at the 2019 Australian National Championships;
- Recalled\* at the 2019 Australian International Oireachtas;
- International dancers recalled\* at their qualifying national championships; OR
- Received a top 5 placing at any championship event in the 2019 calendar year or a first place in the Pacific Open Premiership in 2019.

\* Sections not subject to a recall, the dancer placed in the top 50% of their section.

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#### **SUB-MINOR BELT**

**8 years and under**

heavy jig (32 bars), reel, and traditional set dance

#### **MINOR BELT**

**9 to 11 years**

choice heavy dance\*, choice light dance and own choice set dance

#### **JUNIOR BELT**

**12 to 14 years**

choice heavy dance\*, choice light dance and own choice set dance

#### **INTERMEDIATE BELT**

**15 to 17 years**

choice heavy dance\*, choice light dance and own choice set dance

#### **SENIOR BELT**

**18 years and over**

choice heavy dance\*, choice light dance and own choice set dance

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### AWARDS AND NOTES

- All championship entries will receive the event T-Shirt (size to be listed on entry).
- Sections up to and including 35 competitors will all receive a place; and Perpetual belt for winner.
- 60% recall for sections of 36 or greater competitors. In the event of a recall, all recalled dancers will receive a place.

Open to dancers not competing in The Pacific Belt championship.

<b>TUS/PRIMARY</b>	tus reel or tus slip jig

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### PREMIERSHIP

Ages for premiership sections will be split upon entries (minimum 8 per section)

<b>BUN/BEGINNER</b>	choice bun light dance	choice bun light dance
<b>TUS/PRIMARY</b>	choice bun/tus light dance	choice bun/tus heavy dance (heavy jig, traditional hornpipe or traditional set dance)
<b>OPEN **</b>	heavy jig or hornpipe	slip jig or reel

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### SET DANCE CUPS

Ages for set dance cup sections will be split upon entries (minimum 8 per section).

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### AWARDS AND NOTES

- Bun premiership dancers will perform reel as first dance only, if selected.
- Warm-up dance, Premiership and Set Dance Cup sections – all competitors will receive a place. Perpetual cup for winner of Set Dance Cup sections. Event T-Shirt available for Premiership dancers to be purchased at time of entry for \$20.00.
- Premierships, Warm-up and Set Dance Cup to be judged by one adjudicator.
- Competitors may enter a maximum of 2 Premiership sections and 2 Warm-up sections.

\*Open Premiership for dancers in Mean 1 to Ard (Intermediate to Open) and who are not competing in The Pacific Belt Championship.

# EVENT RULES AND CONDITIONS

This Championship and Feis is conducted under the rules and regulations of An Coimisiun Le Rince Gaelacha (CLRG) and the Australian Irish Dance Association Inc. (AIDA. inc.) registration no. 31/20

The Age of a competitor shall be taken as on 1st January 2020, as per their regional registration.

In order for entries to be accepted teachers must note that all competitors:

- At date of entry, be registered with an An Coimisiun Le Rince Gaelacha (CLRG) affiliate region for the year 2019-2020;
- Must not, on the date of competition, be ineligible to compete due to any rule; and
- Must complete an official entry and all entry fees (including late fees, if applicable) be paid in accordance with this syllabus.
- No food or drink is to be consumed in the theatre or backstage. Water permitted only.
- Smoking is not permitted within and on the grounds of the event venue.
- Parents are responsible for their children's behaviour both within and outside the event venue.
- The Event Committee reserves the right to remove any parent or spectator and their dependants from the venue that is in breach of the rules of the event, venue or is conducting or behaving inappropriately.

## LODGEMENT OF ENTRIES

- Payment finalised at time of entry. All credit or debit-credit cards accepted.
- School or class entries are not available. special consideration may be requested by email to [team@thepacificbelt.com](mailto:team@thepacificbelt.com) well in advance of the entry close date.
- Teachers of participating competitors will be sent an entry list to review on a fortnightly basis. Teachers should contact [team@thepacificbelt.com](mailto:team@thepacificbelt.com) to check any entry.
- A venue and musician fee of \$25.00 per family is payable at the time of entry and will be automatically applied to your online entry.
- Electronic mark packs are available for purchase with entry (\$5.00 per section). Mark packs will be sent directly to the email address supplied at the time of entry and will be made available at the immediate conclusion of the results ceremony.
- Late entries will be accepted between 30th April and 7th May 2020 (inclusive) at double entry fee. This fee will be automatically added.
- No refunds for any entry money received. Including cases in which your teacher has rejected an individual entry.



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## ORDER OF DANCING AND CONDUCT

- The Event Committee has the right to commence any event section up to 30 minutes prior to the scheduled commencement time, with the exception of the first section of the day.

### Competitors must:

- Obey all instructions of the Event Committee and Stage Personnel otherwise permission to dance will be withdrawn;
- Dance in numerical order as published in the official program;
- Dance to the music supplied by the Event Committee. Teachers may be required to supply their own music for set dances;
- Dancers must be in costume and ready to dance, not less than 30 minutes prior to the time scheduled for their section; and
- Present at marshalling area when called to do so by Stage Personnel. Sections will only be called once.
- Should a dancer lose a heel, shoe or a shoe lace becomes untied, he/she may stand back, allowing the other dancer/s to continue dancing uninhibited. In such cases, the dancer concerned will be permitted to re-dance as soon as deemed practicable by the Stage Personnel.
- No liability is accepted by the Event Committee for any injury caused by any person, including but not limited to; competitors, however caused and whether or not caused by negligence or default of the Event Committee, its servants or agents. The lodgement of an entry into this event will be deemed an acceptance of this provision.
- Should a dancer fall, slip or bump into another dancer on stage, whether in solos or team event, the adjudicator must ring the bell thereby stopping the performance of all dancers on stage. Dancers affected will be permitted to re-dance and will be marked at the discretion of each individual adjudicator.
- Should in the opinion of the Stage Personnel (in consultation if deemed necessary with medical personnel) a dancer be unfit to re-dance, and if such dancer insists on performing the dancer concerned will only be permitted to re-dance on completion of a formal declaration which removes the organising committee of any liability. Any repeat accident/incident which results in that dancer being unable to complete the required number of bars in any round, will result in the dancer withdrawing without question from the competition.
- If a dancer falls during the last 8 bars of any performance, then he/she will only be required to dance the last 16 bars of that dance again at a time convenient to both the dancers and the stage personnel.
- A competitor must not walk off the stage during a performance unless instructed to do so by an adjudicator. A dancer who dismisses himself or herself from the stage without the permission of an adjudicator will not be marked for that particular dance.
- If at any stage during a performance on stage an adjudicator feels that, due to the health and safety of a performer on stage that the performance should be stopped, the adjudicator must ring the bell.
- Respect for fellow competitors on stage is a requirement at all times. Lack of respect or courtesy for fellow competitors by aggressive dancing on stage will be subject to penalty at the discretion of each individual adjudicator.
- Sub-Minor and Minor Belt may dance 3 at a time for heavy and light rounds time permitting. Junior, Intermediate and Senior belts will dance 2 at a time for heavy round and 2 at a time for light round.
- Open premierships; 11 and under, may dance 3 at a time for heavy and light rounds. 12 and over will dance 2 at a time for heavy round and 2 at a time for light round.
- Bun and Tus Premierships; will dance 3 at a time for both rounds.
- Dancers must be in full costume (including dance shoes) during their presentation ceremony.
- All competition rules set-out by CLRG and AIDA Inc.; including costume, makeup, artificial carriage aids and over-toe restrictions etc. will apply. Please inquire with your registered TCRG for more information.



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## PHOTOGRAPHY POLICY

- The Event Committee of The Pacific Belt may appoint an official photographer. The appointed photographer will take action shots and presentation photos. Such photographs may be subsequently used for marketing and promotional purposes of this event in future years. Should any dancer or dancer's parent/legal guardian wish to be excluded from any of these photographs, please contact the Event Committee.
- No photography or video recording devices including mobile phones are to be used by any members of the audience during the course of the Championship, Open and Tus Premiership, Tus warm-up dance, Set Dance Cup events. Unauthorised recording of sound and image is strictly prohibited. The Event Committee is authorised to request any offender to leave the audience and delete unauthorised content.
- Flash-free photography and videoing is permitted of all Presentation Ceremonies and Bun Premiership sections (including Bun warm-up dance).
